

## OFSAA Age Classifications for the 2011-12 School Year

OFSAA By-Law 5, Eligibility for Competition, Section 4 - Individuals, subsection (iii), states:

“meet the following age requirements”

**Senior** The individual’s birth certificate indicates that he/she has not yet reached his/her 19<sup>th</sup> birthday by January 1<sup>st</sup> prior to the start of the school year in which the competition is held.

**Junior** The individual’s birth certificate indicates that he/she has not yet reached his/her 15<sup>th</sup> birthday by January 1<sup>st</sup> prior to the start of the school year in which the competition is held.

**Midget** the individual’s birth certificate indicates that he/she has not yet reached his/her 14<sup>th</sup> birthday by January 1<sup>st</sup> prior to the start of the school year in which the competition is held. Students may compete in this category for one year only in Grade 9.”

For the **2011-2012 school year**, a Midget will be born in 1997 or later and may only compete at OFSAA in the Midget category for one year in Grade 9. A Junior will be born in 1996 or 1997, and a Senior will be born in 1992 or later.

### Years of Eligibility

Coaches and students are reminded that students are eligible to compete for no more than five consecutive years from date of entry into Grade 9. There is no appeal to this rule.
